Riviera's Golden Age. Stylish details abound from hand-painted frescoes to mother-of-pearl wall tiles, and enamelled lava-stone tabletops decorated with Jean Cocteau-inspired drawings. Somehow it also manages to retain a homely feel. Guests are welcomed into a delightfully informal reception lobby and seated on rattan chairs and a sofa that curves beside the floor-to-ceiling window with its seaside vista.

## Service and Facilities

La Pérouse punches above its four-star weight on facilities. With the sound of trickling water and a vista onto a cacti-dotted cliff face, the pool area is the perfect place to relax. Take a sauna or head up to the rooftop to enjoy the Mediterranean views. The labyrinth of lifts (and staircases) to some bedrooms is rather confusing – though curiously in keeping with the eponymous French maritime explorer who inspired the hotel's name. Older guests should be aware of steps to access communal facilities including the restaurant and pool area. Service is prompt and friendly.

## Rooms

Its 53 bedrooms and suites have been stylishly reupholstered in sandy tones. The seaside theme continues into the details with coral lamps from Palermo and shell-shaped wardrobe handles. Most rooms have balconies offering dreamy Mediterranean views, while Junior suites have a double outlook. The Mediterranean Suite comes complete with a rooftop terrace and hot tub. Hypoallergenic pillows, televisions and minibars come as standard, while suites also have Nespresso machines. Bergamot-infused toiletries are made by the Grasse perfume manufacturer, Fragonard. There are even night-time chocolate treats brought to your room.

## Food and Drink

Sheltered amongst century-old lemon trees and abundant jasmine plants, Le Patio restaurant is a Mediterranean feast for the senses. Interior designers Friedman and Versace collected a team of local artisans to complete the look: from a turquoise bar complete with shell marquetry to a second bar sculpted with marine-themed reliefs. Chef Damien Andrews offers a menu rich in local and seasonal ingredients. Attention to detail shows in the bespoke lemon-infused olive oil from St Michel oil mill in Menton. Signature dishes include focaccia French toast with Peymeinade goat's cheese and thyme-roasted stone bass with celery mousseline, pattypan squash and glassworts. Breakfast here is a generous buffet including homemade pastries, eggs, salads, and hot and cold meats.

## Value for Money

9 / 10

Double rooms from €200 (£173) in low season; and from €360 (£311) in high. Breakfast excluded (€30 [£26]).

One Junior suite (with sea view) and Superior rooms (with garden view) have been adapted for guests with disabilities.

## Family-Friendly?
